Dr. Taylor will give two talks, titled:

Dr. Twyman, a former President of the Association for Behavior Analysis International (2007-2008), is the V.P. of Learning Sciences and Technologies at ABA Technologies, and the Director of Innovation & Technology for the U.S. Dept. of Education's national Center on Innovations in Learning. She was previously Vice President of Instructional Development at Headsprout, an award-winning learning sciences technology company. Dr. Twyman holds faculty positions as Professor of Behavior Analysis at Florida Institute of Technology and Associate Professor of Pediatrics at the University of Mass. Medical School/Shriver Center. She has presented and published worldwide on instructional design, improving education, and educational technology, including a presentation on leveraging new educational technologies for diverse settings at the United Nations in 2011. Dr. Twyman has received numerous awards for her distinguished contributions to educational research and practice.



Dr. Taylor, co-founder and Executive Director of Alpine Learning Group and Senior Clinical Advisor for Rethink, has specialized in the education and treatment of children with autism for nearly 30 years. She holds a Doctorate of Psychology from Rutgers University, and a Master's in Early Childhood Special Education from Columbia University. She was past Associate Editor for the Journal of Applied Behavior Analysis and currently serves on the editorial board. She also serves on the editorial board of Behavioral Interventions. She is a member of the Behavior Analyst Certification Board and serves on the Autism Advisory Group for the Cambridge Center for Behavioral Studies. Dr. Taylor is active in the autism research community and has published numerous articles and book chapters on effective interventions for autism.
